DISTRICT OVERVIEW

Fremont Community School District is a Title 1 district located in eastern Nebraska. The district includes a total of 12 schools serving 4450 Grade Pre-K-12 students. The professional staff includes 301 teachers, with 295 support personnel and administrators.

NEBRASKA STATE ACCOUNTABILITY TESTS

After Fremont Community School District used the Journeys program for the 2010-2011 academic year, scores from the Nebraska State Accountability Tests were collected to assess how Journeys affected student reading performance.

Nebraska State Accountability Tests are based on Nebraska's Content Standards and reflect the essential concepts and skills students are expected to know and perform. The foundational skills included are communication, problem solving, resource access and utilization, and linking and generating knowledge.

Student scores can be converted into a proficiency level which indicates if students have mastered the content standards in a given subject and grade level.

In Nebraska student test scores can be categorized into one of three levels of mastery: Below, Meets, and Exceeds.



STUDENT SUCCESS WITH JOURNEYS

To assess if implementing **Journeys** had an impact on learning, student test scores from the Spring of 2010 (prior to using the program) and the Spring of 2011 (after the first year of usage) were obtained for Grades 3-5. These findings are presented in Figure 1.

The comparison of achievement scores revealed that at all grade levels examined the percentages of students scoring Meets or higher were greater in 2011, after using Journeys, than the previous year, with an average gain of over 8%.

CONCLUSION

This one-year examination of a districtwide implementation of Journeys in Fremont Community School District revealed that the program was associated with increased reading performance. This case study provides evidence that Journeys will be effective in improving students' reading proficiency in other districts with similar demographics and characteristics.
