Anyone who teaches writing knows that sometimes the hardest part about it is getting students to write at all.

But as Kelly reminds us, what we sometimes forget is that, at some point, every writer is reluctant to write. It's the conditions—not the kids—that determine success. In *Every Kid a Writer*, Kelly provides six field-tested strategies to get everyone in the classroom writing with energy and enthusiasm:

- use mentors and modeling
- create a safe and daily space for writing

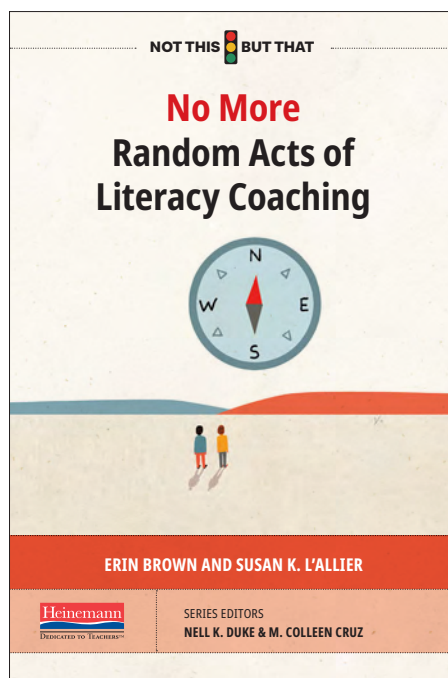

We all have the intention of using our classroom to envision a better world, but what gets in our way? Our uncertainty about how to discuss implicit and systemic bias in our classroom is one of the reasons we avoid this necessary work. In *Social Justice Talk*, Chris Hass details how to facilitate rich discussions that disrupt the harmful social beliefs and practices we and our students are immersed in every day.

The first chapter dives into an important first step, knowing yourself, while the third chapter stresses the importance of knowing your students. Other critical topics include:

- classrooms that center on social critique
- how children navigate diverse perspectives
- using issue-based literature
- placing social justice at the core of the Morning Meeting
- supporting students to speak up
- helping students move from social justice talk to action.

Each chapter is filled with vignettes, transcripts, and video clips from real classrooms and families that offer realistic expectations and models of what we can expect and hope for when we take on this work.

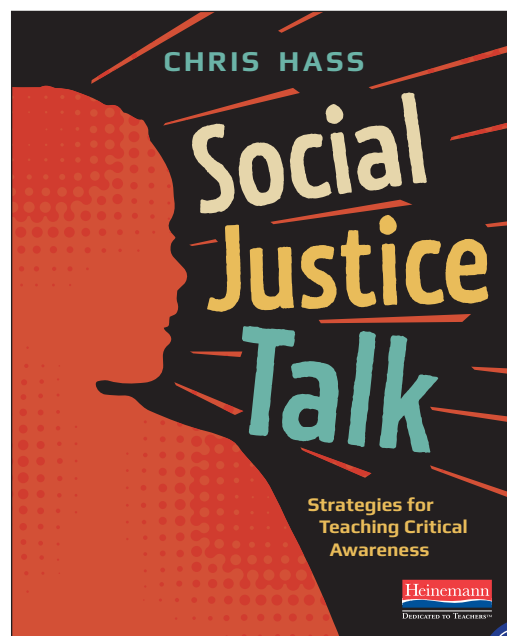

Mistakes are not the problem. The shame we attach to mistakes and inability to grow from them is.

Mistakes are part of learning. Every educator knows this. But what happens before and after a mistake that facilitates that learning is rarely explored practically. Colleen provides research, examples, and tools that help teachers destigmatize mistake-making so that they and their students can do the real work of growth. In *Risk. Fail. Rise.* teachers will learn how to address their own teaching mistakes, model with their own mistake-making, and improve their responses to others' mistakes.

The more aware we are of why we make mistakes, what we can do to avoid unnecessary ones, and respond to useful ones, the more our classroom will be a place of risk-taking and growth for all students.
