

 surveys, landscape analysis, and planning. Each entry includes a photo and/or
 map along with critical-thinking questions.
- **Reading the Physical Landscape** walks students through the process of examining a physical landscape, identifying physical features, and understanding the processes that create features in the landscape.
- Reading the Cultural Landscape shows students how to identify the visible imprints of humans and cultures on the landscape and to understand the processes that shaped the landscape.
- Your Turn: Geography in the Field requires students to analyze a photograph, make observations, ask questions, and think through their answers.

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
